



# Maintenance of **CERTIFICATION**

With Content Created By and For Neuro-Ophthalmologists

Part I	Maintain a valid, unrestricted license to practice medicine in all states in which you practice.
Part II	Complete one patient safety activity. Every two years, attest to the completion of at least 50 CME credits, including 16 credits of self-assessment. Your credits can be specific to neuro-ophthalmology or from your other clinical interest areas.
Part III	The new <b>Quarterly Questions</b> program invites you to select and answer clinically relevant neuro-ophthalmology knowledge questions and stay up to date by reading peer-reviewed literature, including selections from the <i>Journal of Neuro-Ophthalmology</i> .
